



SUPPORTING MEN AFFECTED BY COMMERCIAL SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

SASE takes the view that men involved in prostitution or affected by CSE in other ways are just as likely to have complex needs and deserving of adequate support.

Because of the gendered nature of prostitution, with most commonly male purchasers and women as suppliers, much of the research in this area has focused on the particular needs of women, as well as the context of gender inequality.

Our analysis of male involvement in CSE is that it is a cause and consequence of other forms of inequality - such as economic marginalisation.

Much of the advice and research we provide on this website is specialised and derives out of research on women. However, many of the strategies adopted would be equally as effective when working with men.
